WELCOME

We welcome you to Nara Pre-School. Nara is part of the **bestchance** Kindergarten Cluster. This will be an exciting year, both for your child and your family. Our program is play-based, open ended and child centred, focusing on the needs and interests of the children, providing them with a wide range of learning experiences where they can explore, discover and develop in a warm and supportive atmosphere and environment. The staff for Three Year Old Kindergarten comprises of Nikki (Teacher Educator), Takano (Assistant Educator).

CLUSTER MANAGEMENT

The kindergarten is managed by the **bestchance** Kindergarten Cluster who is the “Approved Provider” accountable to the Department of Education and Training (DET).

PARENT ADVISORY GROUP

Families can choose to actively engage with their kindergarten and the kindergartens Early Years Management organisation **bestchance** by participating in the Parent Advisory Group (PAG). The PAG provides families with the opportunity to enhance their child’s kindergarten experience and connect with the broader community. All families are welcome to be part of the PAG.

The hours and session times for the 3 year old program are split into 2 groups. Each group attends five (5) hours per week.

WHY IS KINDERGARTEN IMPORTANT?

Three year old kindergarten is often the first year of your child's formal education journey. Learning in the early years lays the foundation for on-going learning and sets children on a positive path for life.

At kindergarten, children learn through play. The play based learning experiences enable children to explore and investigate ideas, while developing qualities such as sharing, independent thinking, confidence, negotiating, respect for others, cooperation, turn-taking and expressing emotions.

Our indoor–outdoor program provides opportunities for children to develop their physical, language, social, emotional, and cognitive skills on their own terms, in their own time, in their own unique way. These skills will assist your child throughout their life.

As parents/grandparents/carers, you are the key to their learning process and know your child best. We strive for families and staff to work together in providing meaningful and relevant learning experiences for the children.

At Nara we believe a quality learning environment is where children are empowered to explore and discover through play, where children’s creativity, imagination and collaboration are fostered through a holistic approach. We see children as competent and capable learners and hold high expectations for each child’s learning.

We believe play provides the opportunity to expand their world, to identify and solve problems that are relevant and meaningful. We believe in providing children with opportunities to visit and revisit experiences, giving them time to develop and build their skills.

A rich and engaging learning environment draws on each child's interests, strengths and their individual and family experiences. It incorporates materials that are open ended, challenging and represent the children's family, community and the natural environment.

We believe each child should feel they are a valued member of the group and an active participant in the program. We believe that a strong partnership between children, families, the community and educators enhances the sense of belonging and opportunities for learning for all.

We believe that educators should constantly analyse and reflect on children's learning and their teaching practices. They should support and scaffold children's learning and help them work towards the learning outcomes from the Australian and Victorian Early Years Frameworks.

FIRST DAYS AT KINDERGARTEN

Educators try to make starting kindergarten as positive and welcoming as possible by beginning the year with a staggered orientation period. This allows the children and educators to get to know each other and learn the basic routines in a comfortable and relaxed setting.

A staggered orientation period means that children can begin kindergarten in a smaller group setting for shorter periods of time. All children come to kindergarten with different needs, expectations and experiences. We are committed to working with families to ensure that starting kindergarten is a positive and meaningful experience that meets the needs of all children and families.

PREPARATION FOR KINDERGARTEN

Toileting: The educators are here to assist your child at whatever stage they are at in the toilet training process. Please feel free to speak with the educators, should your family have any specific questions, concerns or needs. If your child is new to the toileting process, please provide several pairs of underwear and spare clothing. If your child is using nappies or pull-ups please provide spares.

WHAT TO BRING TO KINDERGARTEN

A reasonably sized bag or backpack containing:



- Water in a labelled drink bottle. Please No milk, juice or cordial.
- Warm clothes that include a rain coat, jacket and beanie, during the winter months. Please ensure clothes are labelled.



- Sunhat during the summer months – wide-brimmed, legionnaire's style or bucket hats are suitable. Please ensure hat is labelled.
- A full set of spare clothes including underwear and socks.



- For each session we only require one piece of fruit, vegetable, dried fruit, olives,

crackers or cheese to share. (A basket will be left out to place the pieces of fruit etc. into at the start of each session.

Please note: Nara supplies smocks and hand towels for children's use.

PROGRESSIVE SNACK TIMES

At Nara the educators provide children with opportunities to exercise their independence at snack times. The program includes a progressive snack time schedule, where the snack table is available for an extended period of time for small groups of children. The children choose to eat when they are hungry and ready, rather than being required to eat according to a regimented timetable. The children are regularly reminded/encouraged to eat during the session, especially half way through the session. The daily indoor and outdoor program remains available during this time.

CLOTHING

Kindergarten is a place for ACTION and learning by DOING.

Please send your children in clothes that are:

- easy to manage by your child
- comfortable to move in
- appropriate for climbing - including shoes with grip (no thongs or Crocs please)
- alright to get messy

In the warmer months children are required to wear a broad brim hat, legionnaire's hat or bucket hat and sunscreen in relation to our SUNSMART guidelines. (Usually this is between 1st September and 30th April.)

In the cooler months children will need a warm jacket and beanie and you may also like to send gumboots and rain coat for outdoor play. Nara Pre-school is an **all-weather** kindergarten where children are free to explore the outdoor environment in suitable wet weather

conditions. Our kindergarten provides many opportunities for children to engage in **messy play** as well.

We allow children to play outside without their shoes on, to allow them to experience sensory awareness, however we monitor the safety issues involved with them being barefoot.



DROP OFF AND COLLECTION

On arrival the parent/grandparent or carer must sign the attendance book with the correct time of arrival, plus write the name of the person who will collect your child at the end of the session. If a friend or relative is collecting your child at the end of the session, please fill in the attendance book accordingly. If this person is not on your list of contacts, please ask for an “Authorisation to collect child” form, which you can request from the educator or co-educator, complete the form and hand it to the educator or co-educator. If the person collecting a child is not known to educators, they will be required to have ID with them for educators to site. This list of authorised people must be up dated if you allow more people to collect your child.

At the end of the session you have the option to come and join in with your child at the experience they are engaged in and spend some time finishing up the session with them.

It is extremely important to pick up your children on time as they may get distressed if they are the only one left at the centre.

When running late to collect your child, please **contact Nara by telephone on 9807-5250** to notify staff of this situation. It is a good idea to have this number saved in your mobile phone on the chance that it might come in handy one day.

Please note there may be a Late Collection Fee when a parent/carer is consistently more than 5 minutes late to collect their child/children from their session. Please refer to the Nara Fees Policy for further information.

Please note if you have children who attend both 4 year old kindergarten and 3 year old kindergarten you are able to utilise the space in the foyer to wait in between session times. You are unable to access the playroom during this time, as the educators will be preparing the room for their next session.

FAMILIES ARE PART OF OUR PROGRAM

Our longstanding sense of community is supported by families being actively involved at Nara. There are a number of different ways that you can be involved in our community.

Stay and Play

Family members are welcome to stay for any part of a session that suits them. The stay and play family member/carer stays for the time they wish and spends time interacting with the children. This provides a wonderful opportunity for the family member/carer to share their child's kindergarten experience with them and to observe him/her in the kindergarten setting.

Stay and play can come in many forms. You may choose to do some cooking, gardening, cleaning or playing a game or reading with the children, or assisting educators with any specific activities or tasks.

Laundry Roster

Each afternoon session, a family is asked to wash the smocks, towels and other miscellaneous items from kindergarten. A volunteer roster will be displayed in the bathroom.

CHILDREN'S BIRTHDAYS

Birthdays are an important celebration and we like to acknowledge this special day at kindergarten. If you wish to, you may bring individual cakes to be shared with the children. Many families choose their child's birthday as their stay and play day so they can share that celebration together.



If you do not wish for your child to have treats provided by other families, for any reason, please consider providing an alternative for your child to enjoy on these special occasions. We are able to keep a small number e.g. 4-6 small items in the freezer or cupboards at one time, please ensure they are suitably labelled.

HEALTH

If your child is ill, please keep him/her at home until they are fully recovered. If your child has an infectious disease please notify the kindergarten and follow the School Exclusion Guidelines (DET).

MEDICATION

Medical conditions (Anaphylaxis/Asthma/Diabetes/Epilepsy/Allergies etc.)

If your child has a diagnosed medical condition or allergies (Asthma, Anaphylaxis, Allergies to Nuts etc.) you must provide a Medical Management Plan in consultation with your doctor.

Please arrange for the appropriate form for the Kindergarten.

Medical Management Plans and any required medications need to be provided to the educators prior to children starting at Kindergarten or your child is unable to stay.



A Risk Management Plan will be developed regarding the best way for the Kindergarten to minimise your child's risk whilst at Kindergarten. This will be done by the Educator in consultation with you.

Medication

Medication provided by families for their child is stored securely at the kindergarten.

Medication will only be given to children if the medicine is provided in its original container with the child's name and within the use by date. Under no circumstances should medication be left in a child's bag. Please tell the educator if your child has medication with them at Kindergarten.

SUN SCREEN AND SUN HATS

From September until April we implement our Sunsmart Policy, please apply sunscreen to your child **before** they come to kindergarten.

Please make sure your child brings a hat, named, every session during this period. It works best if you leave a kindergarten hat in your child's bag, at all times.

If you are participating in "Stay and Play" we ask that you be a role model to the children and wear a sun hat when participating in the outdoor environment at Nara.

For the summer months children are required, as part of our Sun Protection Policy, to have their shoulders covered at all times.

MONEY

During the year there will be a number of fundraising events which you may choose to participate in. The preferred payment option for these events is by Internet Banking Direct Debit or by cheque. Whenever you are making a payment, please provide an envelope with your child's name, group and purpose for the payment (event name) and place it in the locked white box on the wall in the classroom.

COMMUNICATION

There is a pocket for each family located in the bathroom. This is one of the main sources of communication between the kindergarten and home. Please check your pockets before and after each session. We also may send newsletters and other communications by e-mail and encourage families/carers to take advantage of this efficient method of communication.

Throughout the year, the educators will be compiling a portfolio regarding your child's experiences at kindergarten. This portfolio will be added to on a regular basis. You are encouraged to take some time to read your child's portfolio and add contributions to it. Portfolios may be taken home but must be returned back to kindergarten. Should you wish to do this, please let an educator know, so they know where the portfolios are at all times. Portfolios will be presented to families at the end of the year for the children to keep and reflect on.

POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

The policies of this kindergarten are written to reflect the requirements of the Education and Care Services National Law Act 2010, the Education and Care Services National Regulations 2011 and the Victorian Kindergarten Guide 2016.

If families wish to refer to any policies, they may wish to contact an educator and request either a printed or emailed version.

CONTACTING EDUCATORS

Should you wish to discuss your child's kindergarten experience or any part of the program, the educators are available to discuss these queries with you. Please feel free to talk to your educator anytime you have any concerns about your child. Short conversations are best to initiate with your educator at the start or end of a session. You may arrange a meeting or a phone call should you wish to discuss matters privately or for further discussions.

Interpreters are available for parents/carers who feel more comfortable speaking in their first language.

COMPLAINTS AND CONCERNS

All families are encouraged to direct any concerns, complaints or feedback to their child's teacher or the Nominated Supervisor at the kindergarten.

You can also speak the **bestchance** Kindergarten Cluster Management Office on 8562 5153 and ask to speak to either:

- A kindergarten program coordinator; or
- A team leader; or
- The Program Manager
